Alleged /əˈledʒd/ adjective: said or thought by some people to be the stated bad or illegal thing, although you have no proof (*It took 15 years for the alleged criminals* (= people thought to be criminals) to prove their innocence.)

Allegedly /əˈledʒ.ɪd.li/ adverb: *That's where he allegedly killed his wife*.

Scandal: (an action or event that causes) a public feeling of shock and strong moral disapproval: *Their affair caused/created a scandal in the office.*

Amass /əˈmæs/ verb: to get a large amount of something, especially money or information, by collecting it over a long period (*She has amassed a huge fortune from her novels.*)

Shroud / fraud/ verb: to hide something by covering or surrounding it (*Visitors have complained about the scaffolding that shrouds half the castle.*)

Friary / fram.i/: a building in which friars live

Trace: to find someone or something that was lost (*The police are trying to trace the mother of a new-born baby found abandoned outside a hospital.*)

Genealogy / dʒi:.ni'æl.ə.dʒi/: (the study of) the history of the past and present members of a family (*I became interested in the genealogy of my family*.)

Withered /'wið.əd/ describes an arm or leg that has not grown to its correct size because of disease

Tyrant / 'taɪ a .r a nt/ a ruler who has unlimited power over other people, and uses it unfairly and cruelly

Excavate /'ek.skə.veit/ o remove earth that is covering very old objects buried in the ground in order to discover things about the past (*Tintagel Castle is being excavated.*)
